Madelia City Council Chambers April 28th, 2025, 5:30 PM Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Chair Cody Eager at 5:30 pm. Those in attendance were Cody Eager, Matthew Gunderson, Andrew Gappa, and Mark Slater. Glen Christensen was in attendance via phone. Others present include Chris Fischer, Chief Rob Prescher, Celia Simpson, Heather Utz, and Jim Petterson.

Eager asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Gappa made a motion to approve the agenda. Slater seconded. The motion was passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Slater and seconded by Gappa to approve the minutes from March 24th. The motion was passed unanimously.

The board reviewed the program fund reports and outstanding loan reports.

Simpson informed the board that the FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program had been cut. The City had been applying for the program via the FY26 Congressionally Directed Spending and FY26 Community Project funding opportunities through our elected officials to help finance the construction of an accredited levee at the wastewater lift station. She encouraged the board to reach out to their elected officials in any future communication to let them know how critical this program would have been for Madelia.

Simpson brought to the board an invitation to participate in the Minnesota Business Focused on Food and Agriculture (MBFFA) program. This program is led by Greenseam and Minnesota State University Mankato. They have partnered with various regional entities to coordinate programming to support eligible businesses. Blue Earth REV is the regional lead who has invited Madelia to participate in their programming. They will livestream their monthly Lunch and Learn program to communities across the region. Each of those communities is responsible for coordinating food and locations for the event. Businesses who attend the Lunch and Learns, whether in Blue Earth or in the other participating communities would gain access to these speakers, in addition to free or discounted technical assistance from the speakers. Funding is available through the Compeer General Use grant to pay for food/technology to host these events. Simpson asked the board for approval to participate in this program, as well as apply for the Compeer General Use grant. Gappa made a motion to approve Madelia's participation in the MBFFA program as well as an application to the Compeer General Use grant to pay for food/technology to support the events. Christensen seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

A copy of the EDA specialist report was provided in the agenda packet.

The meeting was opened to public comment at 5:41 pm. No public comment was brought before the EDA board at that time. Public comment was closed.

With no further business before the EDA, a Motion was made by Gappa and seconded by Slater to adjourn the meeting at 5:43 pm.

SUBJECT: FY26 Congressionally Directed Spending Requests

DATE: June 23rd, 2025



Staff had sought funding for an accredited levee for the Wastewater Lift Station through an application for FY26 Community Project Funding through Congressman Finstad's office, an application for FY26 Congressionally Directed Spending (FY26 CDS) through Senator Klobuchar's office, and an application for FY26 CDS through Senator Smith's office. If approved, these funds would have been allocated from FEMA's Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program.

On April 4th, we received word that the BRIC program has been scrapped. No application was submitted to Senator Klobuchar's office nor was an application submitted to Senator Smith's office.

**Update:** On June 5th, we received word that the FY26 CDS requests to Senator Klobuchar and Senator Smith had been moved forward to the Senator Appropriations Committee.

Staff thought the program we were applying under was BRIC, however it looks like the request would actually fall under the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program. BRIC was a subset of that program. BRIC was cancelled but the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program is still in place.

SUBJECT: ESMC Project: Riverfront Redevelopment Plan

Update

DATE: June 23rd, 2025



**Background:** In November, staff applied for an Empowering Small Minnesota Communities technical assistance award to develop a Watona Park Riverfront Redevelopment Plan and position ourselves for federal, state, or local funding for implementation. As part of this plan, we have requested research on flood-resistant landscaping, erosion control, and sustainable infrastructure strategies to protect Watona park from recurring flood damage. We have asked the University to assist with site analysis, recommendations for native plantings, permeable surface design, and flood-tolerant recreational features.

**Update:** Staff and Council members met with UMN partners on June 11th at Watona Park for a site visit. Following the site visit, a listening session was held with members of the public to discuss priorities for and the future of Watona Park.

Future workshops will be held in fall. Staff and UMN partners are planning to develop a community survey that can be launched at Park Days to gather additional community input on priorities in the park.



Estimated Costs: \$1500 (Data Entry by City staff)


