Project updates

- **South Center Avenue from Old HWY 60 to 4th Street: Concrete portion**
Nielsen crews have been conducting strength testing on this section of South Center Avenue. Because this stretch is heavily trafficked by semi-trucks, the concrete must meet specific strength requirements before it can be opened. Once the concrete achieves the required strength, the roadway will be opened for through traffic.
- **3rd Street to 1st St Street:**
Nielsen is projecting to start paving, curb/gutter/sidewalk early next week.
- **Main Street Progress:**
Crews are in the process of connecting business services 10/9 & 10/10. This was originally planned to be done on 10/6, however there was an issue with a test that set them back a couple days. As part of this work, sidewalks are being removed/partially removed, which will significantly limit access to businesses in the area over the next few working days. Temporary gravel walkways will be in place to maintain limited access; but please use caution when navigating these areas.
- Once service connections are complete, crews will begin sub cutting the road, installing the underdrain, and prepping the base layer in preparation for further roadway construction.
